



## A Message from the Editor

Welcome to a new Birds and Natural History catalog. It's a pleasure to introduce a rich and diverse crop of new titles. On publication, *Birds of Peru* became an instant classic and is widely recognized as a landmark book. Now it has been brought up to the minute in a new revised and updated paperback edition that includes recently recorded species. Paul Sterry and Brian Small's photographic guides to the birds of Eastern and Western North America have received enthusiastic reviews from all quarters and look set to become the established guides of choice for discerning birders. The quality of photographs and engaging layout mark them out from competing books, and they are keenly priced to boot. Changing gears, Valérie Chansigaud's *All about Birds* is a colorful and lively short history of ornithology; packed with illustrations and potted biographies, it is a treasure trove of useful information. Moving from the general to the particular, we have Nigel Cleere's superb family identification guide, *Nightjars*, an exhaustive photographic guide to the world's 135 species. The book contains as yet unpublished photographs of many elusive and rare species, and is a truly invaluable reference to this cryptic family.

Forshaw and Knight's *Parrots of the World* is a dazzling field guide based on their authoritative work published in 2006. For the new book, they have organized species treatment by region to facilitate field use. One of the most exciting books in this new catalog is Greg Paul's playfully titled *The Princeton Field Guide to Dinosaurs*. Paul has done much to establish the modern "look" of dinosaurs, but in this book, using the conventions of a traditional field guide, he has surpassed himself. The species-by-species treatment, covering more than 735 true dinosaurs, marries informative text with stunning color and black-and-white reconstructions. The result is, quite simply, breathtaking. Whatever your level of interest, this wonderful book is guaranteed to intrigue and entertain. Lastly, do please check out Tui De Roy's gorgeous *Galapagos*, a beautiful photographic study of the wildlife and scenery of the archipelago. Happy browsing!
